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Malaria Treatment Guidelines

Which drug regimen to treat a patient with malaria depends on the clinical status of the patient, the type (species) of the infecting parasite, the area where the infection was acquired and its drug-resistance status, pregnancy status, and finally history of drug allergies, or other medications taken by the patient.

The guidelines support national policy-makers and health care providers to design and implement effective national treatment policies and protocols; promote the use of safe, effective malaria treatment; and protect currently effective malaria treatment against the development of resistance.

The treatment regimens for chloroquine-resistant *P. vivax* infections are quinine sulfate plus doxycycline or tetracycline, or, atovaquone-proguanil, or artemether-lumefantrine, or mefloquine. These treatment options are equally recommended.

Treatment of Malaria (Guidelines for Clinicians)

If the patient received oral treatment prior to receiving IV artesunate, the same medication can be used as follow-on treatment, but a full regimen is required. As for any malaria treatment, the regimen selection should not include the medication used for chemoprophylaxis.

GUIDELINES

Chloroquine is the preferred treatment for any parasite that is sensitive to the drug. But in many parts of the world, the parasites that cause malaria are resistant to chloroquine, and the drug is no longer an effective treatment. Other common antimalarial drugs include: Combination of atovaquone and proguanil (Malarone)

Ibuprofen (5 mg/kg bw) has been used successfully as an alternative in the treatment of malaria and other childhood fevers, but, like aspirin and other non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs, it is no longer recommended because of the risks of gastrointestinal bleeding, renal impairment and Reye's syndrome.

Persons treated for severe malaria with IV artesunate should be monitored for up to 4 weeks after that treatment for evidence of hemolytic anemia. Persons with higher parasitemia seem to have a higher likelihood of delayed hemolytic anemia after treatment with IV artesunate.

Treatment of uncomplicated malaria caused by *P. vivax*, *P. ovale* and *P. malariae* 2(47) *P. vivax*, the second most important species causing human malaria, accounts for about 40% of malaria cases worldwide; it is the dominant malaria species outside Africa.

The approach to treatment of severe malaria will be reviewed here. Issues related to management in both endemic and nonendemic areas will be addressed. Issues related to treatment of nonsevere malaria are discussed separately.

Malaria is a common cause of fever and illness in endemic areas (1, 2). Malaria cannot be diagnosed accurately with any one set of clinical criteria, as the signs and symptoms (fever, chills, headache and anorexia) are non-specific and are common to many diseases and conditions. The appropriateness of particular clinical diagnostic criteria varies from area to area according to the intensity ...

Malaria diagnosis - Guidelines for the Treatment of ...

The current recommendation of experts is to give parenteral antimalarial drugs for the treatment of severe malaria for a minimum of 24 h once started (irrespective of the patient's ability to tolerate oral medication earlier) or until the patient can tolerate oral medication, before giving the oral follow-up treatment.

TREATMENT OF SEVERE MALARIA - Guidelines for the Treatment ...

Patients with suspected malaria should have parasitological confirmation of diagnosis with either microscopy or rapid diagnostic test (RDT) before antimalarial treatment is started. Treatment based on clinical grounds should only be given if diagnostic testing is not immediately accessible within 2 hours of patients presenting for treatment.

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
